Steps for Successful Sight Reading

- 1. If you are able, identify the key signature.
- 2. Identify the note on the page that you think is "DO."
- 3. Ask for the starting pitch.
- 4. Sing the entire scale in solfege, or the five note DRMFSFMRD to establish the key.
- 5. Sing DTD and D S(low) D to establish potential pick-up notes.
- 6. Review the passage from the end and work backwards toward the beginning.
- 7. Look for the hardest rhythms and the largest jumps first.
- 8. Say the rhythms on count-singing and sing the jumps in solfege.
- 9. Observe how the passage uses the scale (in order) versus triads or thirds.
- 10. Look for any accidentals or altered pitches that are outside the keysignature.
- 11. Talk the solfege in rhythm with the hand signs for the entire passage.
- 12. Pick a tempo that will allow you to be successful (a slower one). You don't get points for speed.
- 13. Hum the starting pitch to make sure you are secure in the scale.
- 14. Count yourself off in the correct tempo and using the right time signature.
